### Bracknell Forest

- Bracknell Forest Council are taking a proactive approach to supporting residents with financial hardship and have recently established a Financial Hardship Voluntary Community and Faith Sector Forum.
- A webpage was created in August as a signposting tool for residents to use. This provides useful
  information and links for a range of areas including; benefits, energy support, childcare, food and
  essentials and many more. The page is being redesigned to be more user friendly and provide
  more information on areas such as support with broadband, water bills, scam awareness and

- For those without access to the internet we encourage them to utilise the Community Hub at our Time Square office where our friendly Community Hub staff can provide advice and guidance as well as support residents with referrals where needed. ## Windsor and Maidenhead

- The Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead has launched a new campaign along with community partners to raise awareness of the support that can help those struggling to cope with the rising cost of living.
- Households across the UK are seeing a squeeze on incomes and an increase in the cost of basic essentials due to a combination of factors, including the increase in the energy cap, the National Insurance rise, higher inflation and the impacts of the Ukraine war.
